by offering opportunities for individual and corporate worship, prayer, study, and retreats.

- offering creative and engaging Worship Services for all ages (e.g. Sunday worship; interactive and inclusive "Messy Church")
- supporting each other prayerfully (e.g. Lectionary Reflection group)
- o providing occasions for experiencing 'sacred space' (e.g. retreats)
- equipping and encouraging members to discover new life in the Spirit (all the above and "Food for Thought" breakfast gatherings, Chatsworth Terrace)
- $\circ$  feeding individuals inwardly to enable outward expressions of faith and love

## faithful pastoral caring

by offering generous and inclusive care and hospitality for the congregation and others for whom they are concerned.

- $\circ$   $\,$  ensuring that our activities are welcoming, inclusive, and loving
- affirming the pastoral care that happens whenever people gather (e.g. 'Coffee Club'; men's lunch; birthday lunches; Op Shop; worship)
- o offering 'Care Groups' to build fellowship and connectiveness
- o maintaining a 'safe' environment for all
- $\circ$   $\;$  entrusting the Minister and Elders with oversight of Pastoral Care

#### equipping and encouraging disciples

by offering a variety of opportunities to learn and share God's life-giving stories.

- providing engaging opportunities for learning about faith and Christian practices for people of all ages (e.g. worship services; 'Food for Thought' breakfast gatherings)
- offering study groups (e.g. Lectionary Reflection group; Book group)
- $\circ$   $\;$  identifying and engaging the strengths and giftedness of our members
- o discerning and encouraging leadership potential, at all ages and stages
- encouraging lively, inclusive, contagious discipleship

### seeking justice and serving community

by acting for justice, and seeking opportunities to deepen relationships with the wider community.

- discerning opportunities for partnering with other churches, agencies and community groups
- seeking life-giving connections in the community (*e.g. offering a listening ear and hospitality in the Op Shop*)
- encouraging participation in community justice groups, (e.g. Reconciliation; Oxfam, Amnesty, LinC)
- o promoting environmental responsibility
- responding to special appeals (e.g. using VicTas Synod's 'Justice and International Mission' resources)
